Through this trip, we hope you will be able to fully enjoy the diverse charms of Japan!

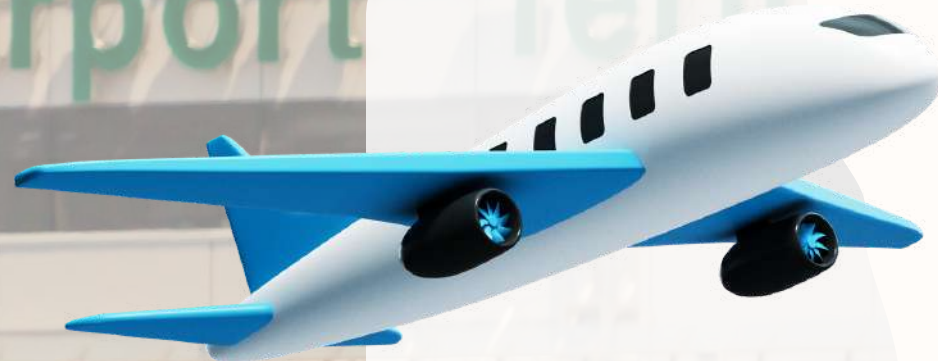

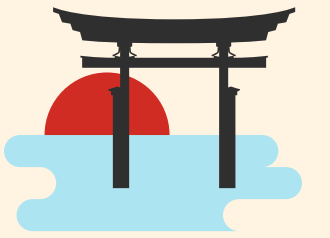

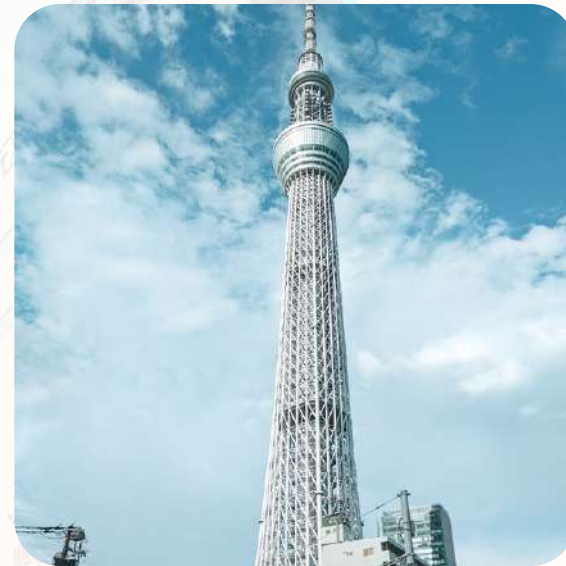

Tokyo Skytree

An iconic landmark of Tokyo, boasting a height of 634m, that attracts many tourists with its height and beauty. Not only can you enjoy the view from the ground, but you can also get a panoramic view of Tokyo's cityscape from the observation deck, and the night view is especially breathtaking.

Asakusa - Sensoji

Sensoji Temple is one of the oldest temples in Japan. It is an iconic Tokyo tourist destination, a place where history and culture are alive. With its iconic main hall, elegant five-story pagoda, and fascinating seasonal festivals and events, a visit here allows you to experience both the past and future of Tokyo.



Asakusa - Nakamisedori

Today, Nakamise has total of 87 stores, 52 on the east side and 35 on the west side, lining up on a 250 meters long street, with beautiful and uniformly illuminated signs and seasonal decorations that stand out against the cobblestones. When visitors from overseas pass through the Kaminarimon Gate, they are greeted by a magnificent Japanese atmosphere that leave them speechless.



Kiriko Experience - Sokichi

You can choose your favorite glass from dozens of pattern designs and combine them to create your own original glass. You can cut it using the Kiriko technique, and the instructor will provide advice, so even beginners can experience it with confidence.



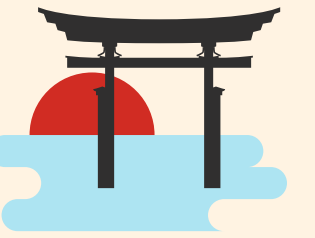

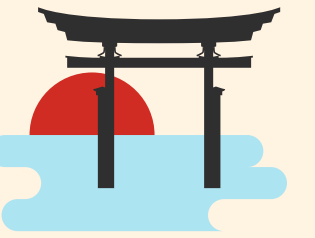
Tokyo Free Day

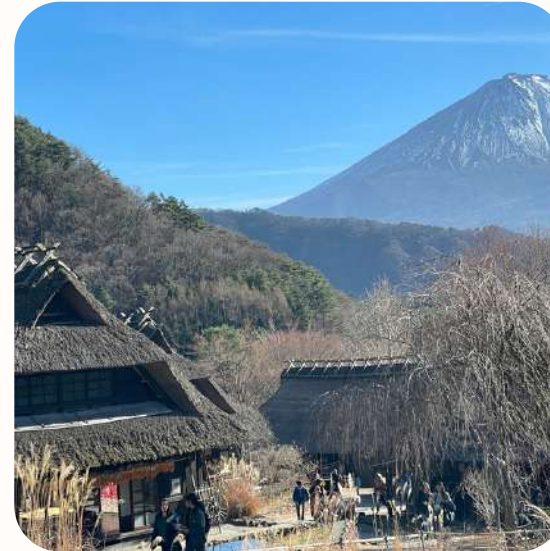

Oshino Hakkai

A group of beautiful ponds where the pure spring water of Mt. Fuji flows. Known for its clear waters and mystical atmosphere, each of the eight ponds has its own unique charm that draws visitors from all over the world. Iyashi no Sato Nemba

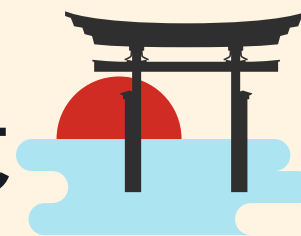


L'Orient Wine

Yamaju Paper

Yamaju Paper, located in Nishijima, Minobu Town, Yamanashi Prefecture, is a long-established paper mill with over 120 years of history in producing traditional Japanese washi paper. They offer hands-on experiences, including factory tours and paper-making workshops, allowing visitors to engage with the rich cultural heritage of washi craftsmanship.



Kakurinbo

This temple is located in a quiet mountain area, providing peace of mind to all who visit. A beautiful garden located within the grounds, allows visitors to enjoy the changes of the seasons. Ancient buildings and Buddhist statues scattered around, also allow visitors to experience traditional Japanese temple culture.



Calligraphy experience (Kakurinbo)

Calligraphy is a traditional Japanese art of expressing beautiful characters using a brush and ink. It has the effect of calming the mind and increasing concentration, and the calligraphy experience at Kakurinbo can be enjoyed by beginners and experienced calligraphers alike in a tranquil natural environment.

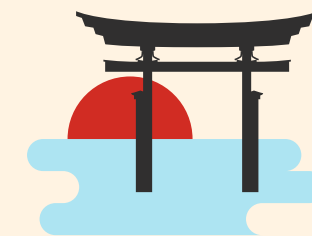


Taikan Sake Brewery

Founded in 1877, the name "Taikan" means success and promotion, and has been drunk as a celebratory sake for the fulfillment of dreams. The rice used is mainly Yamada Nishiki grown in the prefecture, and the brewing water is mainly from the Southern Alps. The sake is carefully brewed by hand, producing a refreshing and dynamic sake.

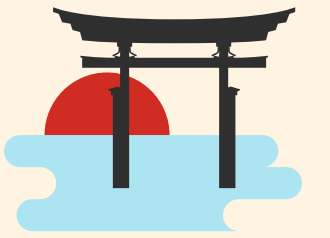

Nijojo

Nijo Castle in Kyoto is one of the most important historical and cultural symbols of Japan. Built by Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1603, the castle served as the center of power during the Edo period. The Ninomaru Palace is adorned with gorgeous sliding door paintings and carvings, and is sure to captivate visitors.



Kiyomizudera

Kiyomizu-dera is a historic temple that can be said to be a symbol of the ancient capital, and is visited by many tourists every year. The view from the stage of Kiyomizu is breathtakingly beautiful, and you can enjoy the scenery of the four seasons. Kiyomizu-dera is also home to the "Kiyomizu Falls" from which it takes its name, and there are always people making prayers here.



Sanjusangendo

Sanjusangendo is a magnificent temple with over a thousand Buddhist statues, and its overwhelming sight captivates all who visit. The main hall houses a Thousand-Armed Kannon statue, and visitors are astonished by its sheer number and intricate carvings. In the tranquil space, visitors can calm their minds and feel the depth of history and culture.



Fushimi Inari Shrine

Fushimi Inari Taisha Shrine in Kyoto is famous for its 1,000 torii gates. This shrine is said to bring good luck in business and household safety, and many worshippers visit. The 1,000 torii gates continue to the top of Mount Inari, and the tunnel of red torii gates creates a fantastic atmosphere.

Atomic Bomb Dome

The Atomic Bomb Dome is the remains of a building located near the hypocenter of the atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima City on August 6, 1945. It is a World Heritage Site that retains its appearance from the time of the bombing, and is preserved as a symbolic presence that conveys the horrors of war and the threat of nuclear weapons.



Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum

The Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum is a facility that conveys the damage caused by the atomic bombing of Hiroshima in 1945. It displays the belongings, photographs, and testimonies of the victims of the bombing, and appeals to the public about the horrors of nuclear weapons and the importance of peace. It serves to convey to visitors the lessons of war and the desire for nuclear abolition.



Miyajima

It is a special place where beautiful nature and historical sites coexist in harmony. Itsukushima Shrine in particular is famous for its large vermilion torii gate that appears to float on the sea. This shrine is also registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and its mysterious beauty captivates all who visit.



Itsukushima Shrine

Located on Miyajima, this shrine is said to have been founded in 593 and has a long history. In particular, the large torii gate, which changes appearance with the tides, leaves a strong impression on visitors. At high tide, the gate looks as if it is floating on the sea, and at low tide you can even approach it on foot.

Osaka Castle

One of the most iconic landmarks in Japanese history and culture. 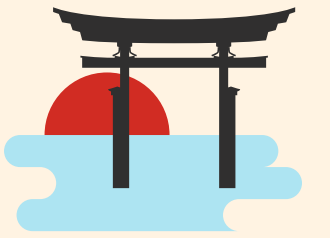
Dotonbori

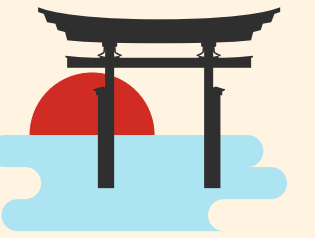
Free day in Osaka and then move to Tokyo

In the evening, we will move to Tokyo by Shinkansen.

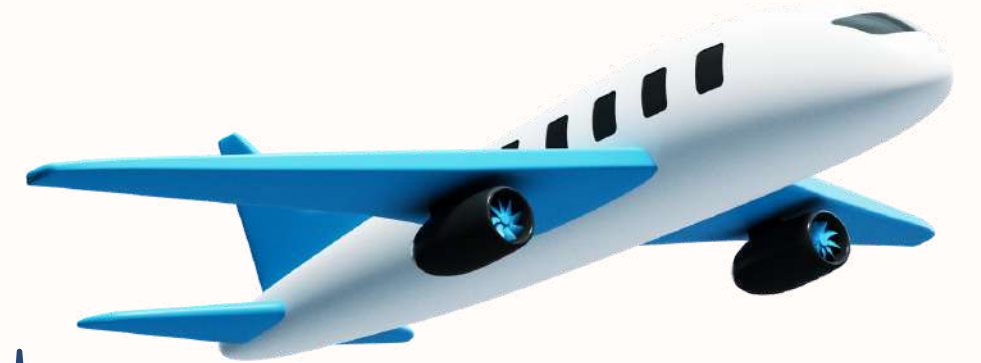
